
## June 17th Guest Speaker Dinner

It was unfortunate that our BOM Guest Speaker scheduled for the June Forum Dinner came down with Covid a few days prior. However, a quick phone call to our July speakers and luckily, they agreed to bring their presentation forward and fill in for us. We thank Doug and Sandra very much for this and our quick-thinking Secretary Terry Frankham who made the call. Doug presented an excellent presentation describing his and Sandra's many adventures sailing the pacific. Aside from Enjoying the cruising a lot of charity work was done along the way supplying reading glasses to villagers, school supplies to some schools.

They first set out from Queensland in 2009 cruising to Vanuatu, New Caledonia, Sydney and onto Melbourne.

In 2010 They sailed from Brisbane via New Caledonia and Port Villa then onto Whangarai on the North Island of New Zealand for the Cyclone season.

Then in 2012 the set off to Auckland then to Fiji and back down to Whangarai to wait out the cyclone season once again before then setting off the following year on a round trip to the Fiji Islands and back. Another round trip this time in 2013 to Fiji and back and then in 2014 a trip up to Vanuatu and New Caledonia before once again returning to Whangarai where they remained until 2017.

In 2017 they set off for a return trip home to Australia sailing via Fiji, New Caledonia to Brisbane, Sydney and finally to Melbourne. And, As Doug mentioned he has swallowed the Anchor however they enjoyed nine wonderful years cruising he Pacific. They were involved in building a Generator House, projects for processing coconut Oil using a Rotary Warm Air Dryer, they supplied around 500,000 pairs of reading glasses.



Sunglasses were donated, cleaned, labelled and packed by volunteers. They were then tried fro individual villagers to ensure they received the correct magnification fro reading.

New Zealand was a good base for the summer where a large crusing Community based themselves comprising some 750 foreign yachts. It is only 6 – 8 days sail to the islands, Good facilities GST Free Goods and services and you can stay for 24 months Duty Free. Also most New Zealand Anchorages are only a day sail apart.
