MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES

The addition of a power boat and new family membership owned by Jason Higgins was circulated as a proposal after the meeting and approved.

It was agreed by the General Committee that Sail Melbourne to be held at RBYC Nov30-Dec 3, 2023.

SAILING REPORT

Minutes of the recent meeting were circulated.

There was a discussion regarding the resources we require to recruit new volunteers. This may need to be produced by a professional with a specific brief.

The sailing committee would like to introduce a mandate on single use plastic bottles to the whole club by 2025. This is covered with MIA. Peter Demura will take to the Cleaner Sailing subcommittee. See link https://www.marinas.net.au/documents/item/879

It was noted that the Bass Strait Cruise will operate under Cat 2 with some addition items compulsory.

ASSET REPORT

We are still waiting for the second quote to dredge the marina

The new Marina gate should be installed mid-late March 2023.

It was confirmed that the Hardstand Cranes are regularly maintained and compliant. (new video induction required for operation).

Parks Vic have nominated Trudy Cummins to continue with the lease negotiations.

PC asked that the eastern channel be re-surveyed to check the lifespan of the prior dredging.

A working group to plan the new driveway is scheduled for next week.



Purchase of Keelboat for Keelboat training (as part of training program)

The General Committee previously supported the purchase of an S80 or similar for the purpose of expanding our training program to include keelboat training, at an estimated cost of \$20k. However since then, market scans have not found any suitable boats at that price range. The General Committee approves increasing the budget to \$40k in acknowledgement of this, and on the basis that further delay represents an opportunity cost. The priority is to get the program up and running as soon as possible.

Redeemer Replacement

The GC approves the search for a Redeemer Replacement at a maximum of \$165K, given the requirements are quite specific, and a suitable second-hand boat will be difficult to find. Decision to purchase will be by the Boating Manager with other club experts consulted, and final approval by GC (by circular email).

SOCIAL SUB COMMITTEE / proposals

Summary of what was agreed.

- 1. Barbecue on Hardstand after Cerberus Race (weather dependent) This proposal was supported.
- Recognition of various groups in the club at Friday night members draw (currently happening –
 this is just formalising it)
 This proposal was supported. The success of the Winners and Grinners night was acknowledged,
 and featuring groups within the club at future Friday night's was strongly supported.
- 3. Celebration after last twilight race (need to consider flexibility if the weather is poor) It was supported to have a special menu option of some kind and promote the night, encouraging people to come to the club for the last twilight. It was thought that booking a band would be too risky, given the short days and risk of inclement weather. It is proposed that next year some twilights during December and February be identified and promoted as an event for all club member (with a band).
- 4. Single Sailors night

 The GC did not support the concept of a "singles night" however a

The GC did not support the concept of a "singles night" – however a party similar to RMYS "White party" or other event (with a view to attracting younger people) would be supported. Summer was seen as the most suitable time of year for this type of event.

5. Art show



The GC supported the concept as a desirable mid-winter event for the club. However, in acknowledgement of the size and complexity of such an event, we would want it to be managed by a team experienced in running an art show. The proposal did a good job of outlining the tasks required but would need a complete budget as well as greater clarity regarding roles and responsibilities and who is performing these tasks (to provide confidence that there was sufficient resourcing to provide the effort required). It was felt that given the size of the project, it is unlikely there is sufficient lead time for this coming winter. Consideration could be given to approaching the Brighton Rotary Club or other organisation with a proven track record in running art shows, with a view to partnering with them, at least for the first one. It was also noted that a Marine Art Show has been run at Beaumaris Yacht Club, run by a woman specialising in this area.

The General Committee appreciates the work the social club is doing in engaging members with the club.

The Honorary Treasurer welcomed all to the meeting via zoom.

- The financials for the month of December were discussed in detail. Certain factors were highlighted. First there was the number of public holidays towards the end of the month.
- We now have no contract or agency staff.
- The food operations are opened 7 days a week in one form, or another compared to other local food outlets that are opened with reduced hours. This was seen as a service to members and members of the public who utilise RBYC.
- The short-term investments have been finalised although there was a typo s/b \$400,000 for the 6 month, investment.
- It was felt that Club should start commencing projects to enhance the Club.
- The installation of the hardstand gate will be finalised in the next week.
- Dredging contract to be finalised so that dredging can take place later this year.
- It was noted that both material supplies and certain tradespersons were in short supply.







Proposal for General Committee 27 February 2023

Approval is requested to commence the search for a replacement course laying boat (currently Redeemer) at an estimated cost of \$150k, with approval to \$165k. Pre-approval to purchase based on criteria specified below.

Background and Purpose

An assessment of our requirements for race management and rescue boats has been conducted (see separate document).

This has identified that the highest priority is to replace Redeemer, our course laying boat.

Current State

Redeemer is RBYC's current course laying boat, and a key requirement for center course racing. Due to its poor general condition including osmosis in the hull, the boat is not expected to have a long life ahead of it. It will take time to find a suitable second-hand replacement which meets the requirements, ie

- Hard hulled
- Caters for 3 people
- Capable of travelling at 20 knots
- Need not be as large as the Committee Vessel (More cockpit than cabin)
- Toilet preferred
- Can be used as a backup OTB start vessel / finish boat
- Able to be fitted with towing post

A new boat would not be affordable – it is estimated that a suitable second hand boat would cost in the vicinity of \$150k.

If a suitable boat is found, it would be prudent to purchase it immediately, without lengthy approval processes.

Recommendation

Approve a maximum of \$165k to purchase a suitable course laying boat, if the right boat is found. Decision to purchase to be delegated to Boating Manager in conjunction with approval by two flag officers.

Social Committee

The Social Committee has put forward the following proposals. The GC is asked to either accept or reject each proposal, or ask for further work to be done to enable a decision to be made.

- Barbecue on Hardstand after Cerberus Race (weather dependent)
- Recognition of various groups in the club at Friday night members draw (currently happening – this is just formalising it)

Every work submitted is by an artist – some emerging, others with established exhibiting practices and many that make art because it is important to who they are and are looking for that opportunity to exhibit for the first time. The show is truly democratic and egalitarian.

It will be supported and promoted in a way that engages all members of RBYC, local residents and bayside sailing community.

Option 1 - 3 day exhibition (7 day work schedule)

- Review these four things:
 - O What went right?
 - O What went wrong?
 - What do you wish you had known?
 - What would you do differently next time?

Once we have a reliable system in place, art exhibitions will be much less stressful the next year

Recommendation

At this time the GC is being asked to approve how long and when the Bayview Room will be made available for as well as what funding will be made available to support the exhibition.

Once this is done a project plan, including responsibilities, will likely be submitted for final approval and sign off. This will be completed using the above timeline and working backwards from approved exhibition dates.
