# COMMODORE'S REPORT

# Welcome to the 2021-2022 Sailing Season at your Club.

To all our members, the General Committee extends our thanks for your continued support through these incredibly trying times. We are very conscious of the limits that have been placed on the enjoyment of sailing, swimming and working out in our gym etc. and appreciate all the renewals of membership. What has been a very encouraging sign for the future is the very significant increase in Club membership over the last year. The added imposition of the repairs to the Brighton Pier has been trying, but the end is in sight, the pier is expected to be operational by the end of September. The treasurer and general committee have taken a very conservative approach financially and we can report that financially the Club has come through the 2020-2021 year in a much-improved position both with operational surplus and cashflow.

The sailing committee led by Club Captain Brett Heath have worked hard to develop this next season's program to be more varied and enjoyable with more passage races, the introduction of Sunday pursuits and the new format Brighton Championship for keelboats. Off the Beach will be enhanced with seven Sunday race days, Thursday evening short course racing and if restrictions allow the George Mac Regatta and Sail Melbourne are planned to run December-January obviously subject to COVID restrictions. The One Design fleets of Etchells, Dragons, 2.4mR and now and small fleet of VX-Ones's will be supported with Saturday afternoon racing all season. We are also working on pathways to educate and develop members and new members to assist our loval and treasured race management team and volunteers.

We will continue to work on the marina and hardstand maintenance to maximise the life of both facilities

and hope that the seabed lease can be finalised for the next 21 years with Parks Victoria this season. By now the long-planned Photo-Voltaic Solar Power should be operating and providing our contribution to minimising power use and greenhouse gas emission. The Club has also been working with the Government through the office of Minister Horne and Parks Victoria to facilitate the dredging of the heavily silted up public boating channel between the marina and the "dog Beach" and believe we have an agreement that this will happen by December this year. Added to that the Asset Committee is now working on a Strategic Asset Management Program so as to maintain all the Clubs assets in a more productive and proactive rather than reactive manner.

The General Committee is very pleased Phil Hall has accepted the role of General Manager, we have every confidence that, with his extensive background and connections in the sailing world and his experience in Club management, we will continue to develop RBYC as a preferred destination for sailing and hospitality for the Bayside region.

Stage 4 of the Clubhouse Master Plan is to redo the front forecourt/garden to include a circular driveway, a much-needed Club enhancement for Members, guests, functions and weddings to enable safe drop off and pickup and improve our openness to the wider community. It will also improve safety of deliveries and rubbish removal as trucks will be off beach road. Unfortunately, the existing permits lapsed when Club architect Scott Sheldon suffered a stroke, but he has recovered well and has now lodged plans for the renewal of the permits. Depending on how we as a Club survive through the year financially, it will definitely be the next stage of the Club's development. Plans should be available for comment by the AGM.

The start of the season saw cancellation for most events, either from COVID or uncooperative weather. Non-aggregate racing was allowed to the relief of many from the last week of October. This allowed us to get out on the water under masks to enjoy the freedoms we had all probably taken for granted up until the pandemic. Finally, by the end of November racing with spinnakers was allowed, and aggregate racing began. Our own George Mac regatta had a great list of entrant's eager for a sail, but sadly this time weather saw it abandoned without a race. Opening Day was squeezed into the first half of the season — late December, and enjoyed by many.

Over Christmas, the ORCV Rudder Cup was the only ocean race that went ahead. Congratulations to our only finisher – Blue Water Tracks, with Cartouche retiring.

Even the Cock of the Bay race format was adapted to allow it to go ahead. 18 entrants from RBYC. A great turnout and a fun race started in light air and finishing under magnificent sailing conditions in Mornington.

Stand out performances by BKT JAMHU 3rd in DIV1 IRC, AMS & My Happy Place 3rd in DIV3 PHS. Special mention for the Commodore and It's a Privilege for a 1st in the DIV4 OMB.

Most regatta's both state and national have been cancelled. To those that did get to sail congratulations for getting to an event that went ahead and for your results. Persistence is the key here.

The Brighton Championship was challenging this season. 5 races were completed with the weather and lockdowns again the culprit for many cancellations. Congratulations to the winners; AMS & IRC – REVERIE & PHS – TRUE COLOURS.

The cruising division, started this season, had to be separated on a countback. Congratulations to the winners of the Ingenue Trophy – ANDALUCIA. Looking forward to you all competing in an extended series next season.

BLISS was held with 17 boats battling it out.

Congratulations to the victors: AMS & PHS – WILD CHILD & IRC – SERIOUS YAHOO.

Participation in Sunday morning programs is encouraging under the circumstances. Disappointingly the Stonehaven Cup was postponed until next year. We are looking forward to an uninterrupted season where we can build on the hard work of previous seasons and continue to build our junior and youth fleets.

Wednesday keelboat sailing both afternoon and twilight has seen fantastic fleets enjoying great weather and close racing. It is great to see so many members enjoying the club on this day. We trialled Wednesday racing through January, it was great to see so many boats joining in. We shall pencil this in the calendar for future seasons.

This season has seen the creation of Thursday OTB twilight sailing. A great success with many sailors honing their skills and enjoying the social side with dinner afterwards.

Thanks to all members for getting involved and making RBYC such a vibrant place to be.

Most importantly I would like to thank all our volunteers, race management team and staff who have worked diligently to ensure RBYC's club

programs have gone ahead and given our members a chance to enjoy sailing. For this, we are extremely grateful.

# RESCUE BOAT WORKING GROUP REPORT

Over the last twelve months there has been intermittent use of the Rescue Craft at RBYC. This has given the volunteers time to do necessary work on the vessel and associated equipment.

All of our boats undertake a quarterly vessel maintenance program which requires a check of all safety equipment onboard. This has been completed. All engines have had some servicing, but there is still some to be done. This is difficult given the state of the repair to the pier. Harry T also needs some work undertaken in relation to one of its's engines. Apart from this Harry T also was anti-fouled. Redeemer had had its annual anti-foul and engines serviced (thanks to MB Marine Services for the great work).

The two-tiler steer Rhibs were on the market and advertised to the public. The sales of these vessels fell through. The rationalisation of the rescue boat fleet will more than likely take place in the second half of next year's sailing season. Hopefully, the next sailing season will be more forgiving.

I would like to thank the "working group" for their hard work – Peter Austin, Paul Jackson, Glen Ferguson, Peter Gebhardt. Paul Pascoe and Peter Strain.

# **ASSETS REPORT**

## **RBYC Assets Strategy**

The Strategic Asset Management Plan (SAMP) is well under way and asset management software has been recommended by On-Tap the Club's accountants which will be integrated into the Club's accounting system. The database of all the Club's assets is nearly complete to capture all of our assets. Once complete management will be able to develop a maintenance program to keep on top of maintaining and prioritising the Clubs assets. The Assets program will also greatly assist in improved budgeting for expenditure.

Occupational Health and Safety program has begun and will be further developed through ongoing review to achieve best practice.

## Compliance

Statutory and scheduled maintenance records have been sighted and are in order and up to date.

### **Dredging the Eastern Channel**

With support from the State Government including some grants RBYC and Parks Victoria have been in constant contact and an agreement has been reached and the dredging is planned for end October early November this year, subject to an environmental report. The dredging is planned to include the entrance to the marina alongside the north end of the breakwater. The equipment which is planned to be used will not enable any dredging within the marina area.

#### Marina Lease

Formal application for the renewal of the seabed lease under the marina with Parks Victoria submitted in July 2019. Discussions with Parks we have been advised that the application has been upgraded to "Direct Negotiation". Commercial Compliance management advised that the leasing team would be in contact soon to progress.

### Sailing Office

New sailing office now set up in the old Windcraft site. This will ensure improved conditions, providing more public exposure and better safety allowing staff to monitor the action on the water.

#### Attenuator

- Through rod replacement and bolt tightening ongoing. Five bays now complete and remaining bays less weathered and to be check though this year.
- Rub collars being made and ongoing replacement this year.
- Bolt tightening around the rest of the marina ongoing.

#### Marina

- Electrical check of all power pedestals with some replacement of circuit breakers is complete
- Mooring lines and cleats have been checked and appear to be in good order.
- Security lights have been monitored and replaced as necessary.
- Ramp to Harry T re-bolted to hardstand and now secure and safe.
- Timber slats to the marina access ramp need replacing — Scheduled ASAP.
- Weed removal treatment is complete,
- Bird droppings provide a continuous battle, however bunting use looks promising

#### Hardstand

- Entrance Gate repaint failed, medium term may need replacement with stainless gate.
- New Vertical fenders to the hardstand working well and recently scraped.

- Trolley wheels for hardstand boats replaced as required.
- Securing rails need replacing.
- Annual hardstand clean-up needed again.

#### **Race Tower**

- Ongoing maintenance to the Race Tower has been hampered due to COVID
- · Roofing repairs have been completed
- Structural steelworks to be sandblasted and painted
- Upstairs floor to be sanded and sealed
- New lining boards partially completed
- Floor joists have been repaired
- Window require new bearings.

#### Clubhouse

- Solar power installation now complete
- Refrigeration rebuild of the cool room and freezer have improved capacity, efficiency and energy savings.
- Ongoing replacement of lighting with energy saving LEDs ongoing.

- Analysis and review of air-conditioning to look at efficiency and energy savings.
- Planning to redesign the front garden and include a circular driveway.
- Renovation of the men's changeroom showers completed.
- Repair of the concrete surface outside the gym.

## **Future Strategy Planning**

With the Marina Seabed Lease renewal with Parks Victoria , the reverting of some marina berths to Club ownership both imminent and the aging wave attenuator requiring continual structural maintenance it is prudent that the Assets and General Committee explore all available options and opportunities as to how our marina may look in the future. Examples could include a reconfiguration of the marina berths to accommodate more flexibility, which is currently constraining occupancy rates .The attenuator or an alternative structure will need to be planned for within the forthcoming lease and will need to be considered soon rather than later.

# MEMBERSHIP REPORT

## Membership as a Key Pillar of our Strategy

Membership is a core focus into the future and was described accordingly in our Strategy Document, with the following aim.

Members feel recognised as members

- Members of all ages and interests value their membership
- Members feel comfortable as part of the RBYC community and proud to be part of it

Membership numbers at the club have grown by seven percent in the last twelve months and are now at their highest level in seven years. This is an impressive result considering the challenges of 2020/2021 with COVID restrictions in place off and on limiting many club activities. With limited travel options locals are looking closer to home for their leisure pursuits and the club has benefitted from this trend. A membership survey conducted in early 2021 provided some meaningful feedback for the general committee.

There was a steady stream of new members prior to and after lockdown, resulting in a seven percent increase membership numbers in June 2021 compared with June 2020.

- a) Total member numbers as at 30 June are 1556 compared with 1446 as at June 2020.
- The percentages across membership categories compared to last year are similar; with a slight increase in Social and Iceberger members.
- c) A slight decrease in Crew and Youth categories reflects reduced sailing opportunities during this period due to COVID. These remain key areas of focus for growth in the coming summer with a return to more racing sailing.

A survey of RBYC membership was conducted in March/April 2021. The aim was to receive structured feedback from a cross section of currently active members to inform club priorities over the near term as well as the long term. The survey consisted of multiple choice questions as well as the opportunity to add comments.

The response rate of 38% was pleasing and provided meaningful feedback.

Some key points from the commentary are as follows;

- Repairing the pier, undertaking the dredging and maintaining the marina are a priority (as expected)
- Some members would like the front entrance to the club on St Kilda St improved
- Some members would like to ensure the priority of sailing while others would like a wider variety of activities
- It is worthy of note that in answer to the question "Would you recommend others to join the club" the following responses were provided; 69% very likely, 26.33% possibly and only 4.67% not likely
- We also received some feedback about how the survey could be improved next time. We plan to do these surveys on a regular basis as the information is very valuable to us.

take-away coffees flowing. The hot outdoor showers were a very welcome addition during COVID lockdowns.

Many local residents continue to be attracted by our open door policy in the café and have joined the club, appreciating our facilities and inclusiveness as well as our sailing programs.

We are very appreciative of the loyalty of long standing members as well as the support of the community through the current crisis.

### **Principal activities**

The principal activities of the Association during the financial year were to continue facilitating and promoting of the sport of sailing generally, and in particular, racing between sailing yachts.

#### Operating result

The deficit of the Association for the financial year amounted to \$ (59,462) (2020: \$ (156,340)).

### Events after the reporting date

On the 15th July, the Victorian Government announced a 5 day lockdown in response to the delta variant outbreak spreading from New South Wales. This lockdown was extended an extra week and restrictions began to lift on the 28th July. Then further outbreaks forced a sixth lockdown to commence on the 6th August. The 6th lockdown is expected to end on Thursday 2nd of September. Given the situation, it is not practical to estimate the impacts of the pandemic on the financial statements of the Association.

Except for the above, no other matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or could significantly affect the operations of the Association, the results of those operations or the state of affairs of the Association in future financial years.

# HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

#### INTRODUCTION

I'm honoured to present the Honorary Treasurer's Report and in doing so provide an overview of our results for the year ended June 2021 including the highlights and some of the ongoing financial challenges.

The operations of our Club were, and continue to be, severely disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic and the temporary closure of the pier over the past twelve months. The main problem has been the rapid nature of the lockdowns and the long drawn out periods when restrictions have been progressively eased. It may come as no surprise to learn that for thre year the Club was under one form or another of restricted trading ranging from total lockdown to capacity limits. This resulted in considerable volatility in revenue from trading operations especially during the winter months in 2020.

Over the year, the Club saw an increase in membership and marina income. During the lockdown periods and travel restrictions many local people "discovered" the Club and its wide range of facilities. Word soon spread and with a warm and friendly welcome from our employees there was a steady flow of new members and boats

The improvement in the net operating surplus from operations and increased cash balance reflects favourably on the management of the Club by our two General Managers and loyal employees and the support of members. Also as was the case last year, the Club is appreciative of the various forms of assistance offered by the Federal, State and Local governments.

In the year ended 30 June 2021, our Club recorded an operating surplus of \$1.1m and an overall deficit of \$59k compared with a deficit of \$156k last year. The Club has recommenced its debt repayments, undertaken major renovations to the men's change rooms and commissioned the installation of a 91.7 kw solar system. The latter will significantly reduce the cost of energy and highlight the Club's commitment to sustainable sailing.

As recent events across Australia have shown, the COVID 19 pandemic is far from over and given the uncertainty of the post COVID world, the General Committee will continue to focus on improving profitability, clubhouse utilisation and marina occupancy. This will enable the continued repayment of debt, channel and limited marina dredging and funding of other projects around the Club.

Looking ahead the major issue to be addressed is the renewal of the seabed lease. With the current marina leases to expire in January 2023 and the marina pens reverting back to Club ownership, the Finance Sub-Committee and General Committee will be examining a range of options for the marina.

### FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

In the year ended June 2021, the Club generated a net operating surplus of \$1.10m compared to \$1.05m in the previous year. As was the case last year, this year's outcomes were boosted by COVID-19 related government grants and subsidies.

Compared to the previous year, total income, excluding government support, fell by 10% and was almost entirely driven by 14% a fall in catering revenue and a 44% decline in sailing revenue. In contrast, membership and marina

and hardstand revenues rose by 3% and 5% respectively. Similarly, expenses fell by 14% with the main contribution coming from rent relief provided by Parks Victoria and a 12% decline in employment costs.

Higher interest payments and depreciation charges more than offset the improvement in operating surplus and overall, the Club generated a net deficit of \$59k, compared to \$156k in 2019/20. A summary income and expense account for 2020/21 is set out below:

The following table provides a conceptual breakdown of the profit and loss statement by major club functions: catering, marina and hardstand, sailing and membership and administration. As expected in 2020/21 the main sources of "surplus" were catering \$172k, marina and hardstand \$568k, while sailing and membership reported "deficits" of \$108k and \$692k respectively. With the continued disruption to activities during the pandemic, these figures are best indicative of the contribution of each area to the Club's performance and we will need to wait for a "normal" year before reaching any robust conclusions.

#### **BAR & CATERING**

The Club's catering and hospitality operations were severely affected by the extended lockdown in the second half of 2020 and the stop start restrictions throughout the first half of 2021. Monthly revenue displayed considerable volatility ranging from just \$17k in August to a peak of \$313k in December. This suggests that once the Club is open, it is well patronised by members and guests. Contributing to the volatility is the revenue from functions. With functions planned weeks ahead, any sudden lockdown or imposition of capacity restrictions means that in most cases these functions are cancelled and in some cases they are not re-booked. There were periods throughout the year where function revenue was zero, while at other times revenue exceeded budgeted amounts. Nevertheless, as the departmental segmentation indicates, the catering operations make a significant contribution to the Club's cash flow.

### MARINA AND HARDSTAND

In 2020/21, despite a slight decline in occupancy to 73% marina revenue was up by 5% following a 1% decline in the previous year. During the year work commenced on the repair of the pier and although access remained limited, this should be restored by the end of September. This will enable the Club to begin actively marketing pens. Agreement has been reached with Parks Victoria on the dredging of the Eastern Channel and it is envisaged that the voluntary contribution made, in good faith, by the Club to the cost of the dredging will ensure the completion before the end of 2021. In the next 18 months or so, the General Committee will be undertaking a renewal of the seabed lease and also determining the occupancy options following the expiry of the marina leases in January 2023.

### **CAPITAL EXPENDITURE**

Capital expenditure for the year totalled \$147k with the main items being the renovation of the male showers and the half the cost of the planned solar panel installation.

### **CASH FLOWS**

During 2019/20, net operating cash flows were \$983k compared with \$335k in the previous year. After allowing for the small increase in working capital, the additional cash allowed the club to undertake some large capital projects and repay additional debts after the ending of the debt repayment moratorium. Due to the omnipresent threat of COVID, the Club employed a very conservative cash management strategy enabling the Club to improve its cash balance at the end of the year to \$1.12m.

### FINANCIAL POSITION

As at the end of June 2021, the total borrowings by the Club were \$1,363k compared with \$1,525k a year earlier. Following the ending of the debt repayment moratorium, loan repayments to the Bank of Melbourne have recommenced. While the Club has improved its short term liquidity, the incessant lockdowns and trading restrictions and uncertainty on the timing and scope of a permanent easing of COVID-19 restrictions all have a bearing on the level on profitability, cash flow and debt going forward.

### CONCLUSION

In 2020/21 activities at the Club were severely affected by the restrictions imposed by the Victorian Government following the spread of COVID-19 throughout the community. The Club remained closed for a large part of the second half of 2020 and was hit with a series of further closures in 2021. This has contributed to high levels of volatility in activity and trading and a fall in revenue but this was more than offset by a reduction in expenses across all major categories resulting in an improvement in the operating surplus.

Unfortunately, we are not yet out of woods. The outcome of the race between the Delta strain and the level of community vaccination will determine, to a large extent, the financial fortunes of the Club. At the moment, as they approach the top mark, there is very little separating the two. To date, the ongoing support of members and the hard work of our dedicated employees have strengthened the Club's resilience and this will continue to be our only major defence until such time as we able to operate without restrictions

# Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 June 2021

The financial statements cover Royal Brighton Yacht Club Inc. as an individual entity. Royal Brighton Yacht Club Inc. is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Victoria under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 ('the Act').

The functional and presentation currency of Royal Brighton Yacht Club Inc. is Australian dollars.

The financial report was authorised for issue by the General Committee on 30 August 2021.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated in note 3: retrospective restatements.

#### 1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements and the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below.

## 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Revenue and other income

#### Revenue from contracts with customers

The core principle of AASB 15 is that revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the Association expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services. Revenue is recognised by applying a five-step model as follows:

- 1. Identify the contract with the customer
- 2. Identify the performance obligations
- 3. Determine the transaction price
- 4. Allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations
- 5. Recognise revenue as and when control of the performance obligations is transferred

Generally the timing of the payment for sale of goods and rendering of services corresponds closely to the timing of satisfaction of the performance obligations, however where there is a difference, it will result in the recognition of a receivable, contract asset or contract liability.

#### Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of food and beverages is recognised at the point of sale, when the economic benefits associated with the transaction flows to the Association and can be reliably measured.

#### (a) Revenue and other income

#### Rendering of services

Revenue from subscriptions, maintenance fees and the lease of marina, hardstand and OTB space is recognised over the period where the customer is entitled to receive benefits from the service provided by the Association. Revenue is recognised when economic benefits are expected to flow to the Association and can be reliably measured.

The Association has numerous long-term leases for Marina space, spanning periods of twelve months and twenty years. Revenue from these leases are defined as operating leases and recognised on a straight-line basis over the agreement terms. All agreements will expire prior to the Association's current lease of the marina.

#### Interest

Interest is recognised as it accrues using the effective interest method, by calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating interest over the relevant period. Interest is allocated using the effective rate, which discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to its respective net carrying amount.

#### Deferred and unearned revenue

The Association receives funds in advance from it's members. These are treated as liabilities of the Association until the requirements of the revenue recognition criteria have been satisfied. These deferred amounts are then released to revenue.

#### (b) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (c) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset are capitalised as part of the cost of that asset.

All other borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

#### (d) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

#### (e) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

#### (f) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for significantly less than fair value have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

#### Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

### Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

Fixed asset class	Depreciation rate
Plant and Equipment	4.00 - 50.00%
Leasehold improvements	2.00 - 50.00%

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

#### (g) Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially on the date that the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

#### Financial assets

All recognised financial assets are subsequently measured in their entirety at either amortised cost or fair value, depending on the classification of the financial assets.

### (g) Financial instruments

#### Financial assets

Classification

On initial recognition, the Association classifies its financial assets into the following categories, those measured at:

- amortised cost
- fair value through profit or loss FVTPL

Financial assets are not reclassified subsequent to their initial recognition unless the Association changes its business model for managing financial assets.

Amortised cost

Assets measured at amortised cost are financial assets where:

- the business model is to hold assets to collect contractual cash flows; and
- the contractual terms give rise on specified dates to cash flows are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

The Association's financial assets measured at amortised cost comprise trade and other receivables and cash and cash equivalents in the statement of financial position.

Subsequent to initial recognition, these assets are carried at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method less provision for impairment.

Interest income is recognised in profit or loss. Gain or loss on derecognition is recognised in profit or loss.

Financial assets through profit or loss

All financial assets not classified as measured at amortised cost as described above are measured at FVTPL.

Net gains or losses, including any interest income are recognised in profit or loss.

Impairment of financial assets

Impairment of financial assets is recognised on an expected credit loss (ECL) basis for the following assets:

#### (g) Financial instruments

#### Financial assets

When determining whether the credit risk of financial assets has increased significantly since initial recognition and when estimating the expected credit loss (ECL), the Association considers reasonable and supportable information that is relevant and available without undue cost or effort. This includes both quantitative and qualitative information and analysis based on the Association's historical experience and informed credit assessment and including forward looking information.

The Association uses the presumption that a financial asset is in default when:

 the other party is unlikely to pay its credit obligations to the Association in full, without recourse to the Association to actions such as realising security (if any is held).

Credit losses are measured as the present value of the difference between the cash flows due to the Association in accordance with the contract and the cash flows expected to be received. This is applied using a probability weighted approach.

#### Trade receivables

Impairment of trade receivables have been determined using the simplified approach in AASB 9 which uses an estimation of lifetime expected credit losses. The Association has determined the probability of non-payment of the receivable and multiplied this by the amount of the expected loss arising from default.

The amount of the impairment is recorded in a separate allowance account with the loss being recognised in finance expense. Once the receivable is determined to be uncollectable then the gross carrying amount is written off against the associated allowance.

Where the Association renegotiates the terms of trade receivables due from certain customers, the new expected cash flows are discounted at the original effective interest rate and any resulting difference to the carrying value is recognised in profit or loss.

#### Other financial assets measured at amortised cost

Impairment of other financial assets measured at amortised cost are determined using the expected credit loss model in AASB 9. On initial recognition of the asset, an estimate of the expected credit losses for the next 12 months is recognised. Where the asset has experienced significant increase in credit risk then the lifetime losses are estimated and recognised.

#### Financial liabilities

The Association measures all financial liabilities initially at fair value less transaction costs, subsequently financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

The financial liabilities of the Association comprise trade payables, bank and other loans and lease liabilities.

#### (h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

#### (i) Leases

At inception of a contract, the Association assesses whether a lease exists - i.e. does the contract convey the right to control the use of an identified asset for a period of time in exchange for consideration.

This involves an assessment of whether:

- The contract involves the use of an identified asset this may be explicitly or implicitly identified within
  the agreement. If the supplier has a substantive substitution right then there is no identified asset.
- The Association has the right to obtain substantially all of the economic benefits from the use of the asset throughout the period of use.
- The Association has the right to direct the use of the asset i.e. decision making rights in relation to changing how and for what purpose the asset is used.

#### Lessee accounting

The non-lease components included in the lease agreement have been separated and are recognised as an expense as incurred.

At the lease commencement, the Association recognises a right-of-use asset and associated lease liability for the lease term. The lease term includes extension periods where the Association believes it is reasonably certain that the option will be exercised.

The right-of-use asset is measured using the cost model where cost on initial recognition comprises of the lease liability, initial direct costs, prepaid lease payments, estimated cost of removal and restoration less any lease incentives received.

The right-of-use asset is depreciated over the lease term on a straight line basis and assessed for impairment in accordance with the impairment of assets accounting policy.

The lease liability is initially measured at the present value of the remaining lease payments at the commencement of the lease. The discount rate is the rate implicit in the lease, however where this cannot be readily determined then the Association's incremental borrowing rate is used.

Subsequent to initial recognition, the lease liability is measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method. The lease liability is remeasured whether there is a lease modification, change in estimate of the lease term or index upon which the lease payments are based (e.g. CPI) or a change in the Association's assessment of lease term.

Where the lease liability is remeasured, the right-of-use asset is adjusted to reflect the remeasurement or is recorded in profit or loss if the carrying amount of the right-of-use asset has been reduced to zero.

#### 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### (i) Leases

Exceptions to lease accounting

The Association has elected to apply the exceptions to lease accounting for both short-term leases (i.e. leases with a term of less than or equal to 12 months) and leases of low-value assets. The Association recognises the payments associated with these leases as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

#### (j) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits expected to be settled more than one year after the end of the reporting period have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may satisfy vesting requirements. Cashflows are discounted using market yields on high quality corporate bond rates incorporating bonds rated AAA or AA by credit agencies, with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cashflows. Changes in the measurement of the liability are recognised in profit or loss.

#### (k) Going concern

The Association's activities resulted in a deficit for the year ended 30 June 2021 of \$59,462 (30 June 2020: deficit \$156,340). It has a net current deficiency as at 30 June 2021 of \$233,079 (30 June 2020: \$378,783). Encompassed within the total is \$452,664 of memberships for the 2022 year received in advance.

The full impact of the COVID-19 situation continues to evolve at the date of this report as the state of Victoria enters its 6th lock-down. The Association is uncertain as to the final impact that the pandemic will have on its financial situation and liquidity and the future results of operations during FY2022.

The financial statements have been prepared on the basis that the Association is a going concern which contemplates the continuity of normal business activity, realisation of assets and settlement of liabilities in the normal course of business for the following reasons:

At 30 June 2021 the Association had net assets of \$4,990,246, cash reserves of \$1,124,009 and generated net cash inflows from operating activities of \$982,979.

As the COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in temporary restrictions over the Association's catering and sailing revenue, management have stress tested their forecast model for more long-term restrictions in their catering revenue streams which has also considered the mitigating impact of the Covid-19 Disaster Payment and other Federal, State and Local Government Support. This also considers costs reductions in relation to catering cost of goods sold and other operating and administrative expenses.

The General Committee believe that the Association will be successful in managing the above matters and accordingly, they have prepared the financial report on a going concern basis. At this time the General Committee are of the opinion that no asset is likely to be realised for an amount less and the amount at which is recorded in the financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2021.

#### 4 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The General Committee make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

#### Key estimates - impairment of property, plant and equipment

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

#### Key estimates - estimation of useful lives of assets

The Association determines the estimated useful lives and related depreciation and amortisation charges for its property, plant and equipment and finite life intangible assets. The useful lives could change significantly as a result of technical innovations or some other event. The depreciation and amortisation charge will increase where the useful lives are less than previously estimated lives, or technically obsolete or non-strategic assets that have been abandoned or sold will be written off or written down

#### Key estimates - receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. The impairment provision is based on the best information at the reporting date.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Australian Government offered various cash stimulus packages to eligible entities to keep staff employed.

Royal Brighton Yacht Club were entitled to the Jobkeeper package between the periods April to September of 2020 and January to March of 2021. During this period, the Government supplemented fortnightly salaries for staff up to \$1,500 per employee during the initial stages of this stimulus package. This amount was decreased to \$1,000 during the second phase, where Royal Brighton Yacht Club was eligible.

Royal Brighton Yacht Club were also entitled to receive Cash Flow Boost, which supplemented eligibe organsations' PAYG withheld obligations during the period March to September 2020. \$50,000 was initially provided during phase 1, which was recorded as income in the 2020 financial year. As the pandemic progressed, the government offered the same amount in phase 2, for the same amount received during phase 1, for a maximum of \$100,000.

Royal Brighton Yacht Club received further support from the local and state governments. Successful applications were made and the Association were entitled to receive cash injections under programs including the Licensed Hospitality Venue Fund and Outdoor Eating and Entertainment Package. The Association also received rent relief over a six-month period for an executed lease with Victoria Parks and the Bayside City Council, given the financial impacts of lockdowns from the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### 19 Financial Risk Management

#### Credit risk

Credit risk refers to the risk that a counterparty will default on its contractual obligations resulting in a financial loss to the Association.

Credit risk arises from cash and cash equivalents and deposits with banks and financial institutions, as well as credit exposure to wholesale and retail customers, including outstanding receivables and committed transactions.

The maximum exposure to credit risk, excluding the value of any collateral or other security, at Reporting Date to recognised financial assets is the carrying amount of those assets, net of any allowance for doubtful debts, as disclosed in the Statement of Financial Position and notes to the financial report.

The Association trades primarily with Association members and other creditworthy third parties, as as such collateral is not requested nor is is the Club's policy to securitise its trade and other receivables.

Receivables balances are monitored on an ongoing basis with the result that the Association's exposure to bad debts is not significant. There are no significant conentrations on credit risk.

#### Market risk

Market risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices.

#### (i) Interest rate risk

The Association is exposed to interest rate risk as funds are borrowed at floating and fixed rates. Borrowings issued at fixed rates expose the Association to fair value interest rate risk.

#### Sensitivity analysis
