Supplementary Sailing Instructions

The Organising Authority is Royal Brighton Yacht Club (RBYC)

1 Official Notice Board

The official notice board will be an electronic online notice board.

2 Signals Made Ashore

- 2.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagstaff at the western end of the rigging lawn.
- 2.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP.

3 On-Shore Facility Locations

- 3.1 The Race Office will be in the RBYC Sailing Office.
- 3.2 The Jury Room will be in the RBYC Committee Room.
- 3.3 First Aid will be in the RBYC Sailing Office and committee vessels when at sea.

4 Class Flags, Courses and Marks

The Class Flags, Courses and Marks are defined in the Appendix A.

5 The Start

A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes rule A4 and A5.

6 Penalty System

Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one penalty turn is required.

7 Time Limits

1 st boat target time	Mark 1 time limit	Finishing window	Race time limit
20mins	15mins	15mins	45mins

- 7.1 Failure to meet the race time limit will not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).
- 7.2 Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat finishes will be scored "Did Not Finish". This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.
- 7.3 Boats failing to finish 10 minutes after the first boat finishes, may be scored an Allocated Place.
- 7.4 The Race Committee may allocate places based on a boat's position on the course when the time limit expires. The decision of the Race Committee is final. This changes rules 35 & A4 & A5.


Courses

Start line

The start line will be bounded by an orange pin buoy at the port end and the Race Committee vessel at the starboard end.

The start line is a mark of the course and must be used for starting and finishing a race only. The start line must **not** be sailed through on the on the downwind leg of either course.
