Professional Background:

My professional background is in the hospitality industry, with over 20 years of experience operating and managing hotels worldwide. I have a Bachelor of Business in Accounting and Hotel Management from Victoria University. My hotel career began with the Accor Hotels network, where I worked for 11 years across multiple hotels in Australia and New Zealand before moving to The Ascott Limited for 15 years. Based in Singapore with Ascott for eight of those years, I led the evolution of revenue management across Ascott's global network of properties. Then, I moved back to Melbourne as General Manager of the Citadines on Bourke, Melbourne, a 380 hotel on Bourke Street. I then transitioned into advisory, serving as a Senior Asset Manager and later Director of Operations for Minett Prime Square, an independent advisory firm specialising in the hospitality industry.

Sailing experience:

My interest in sailing was ignited when working in the Whitsundays as a deckhand and scuba instructor on a day charter sailing boats and rent-a-yacht companies.

I joined RBYC when I bought a share in a keelboat (Chindrina) with a friend and completed my first Bass Strait cruise in 2005. After selling Chindrina, I bought another share in Nimrod II, eventually owning her outright. In October 2023, I sold Nimrod II after an extensive refurbishment.

Working on both Chindrina and Nimrod II sparked an interest in the marine industry, and I am now working in a repair and maintenance business, looking after trailable yachts.

I sail each Saturday as part of the crew on Mirrabooka. On my previous yacht, Nimrod II, our best results were winning the Costello Cup and finishing 2nd in Cruising Spinnaker at the Festival of Sails in 2018.
